FAWNS (Entering Kindergarten)

With a ratio of 6 campers to 1 staff, the Fawns are mixed into the Bucks & Does for group activities. This nurturing environment is a high-energy positive place to have your child all summer and has lots to offer. Camp activities include: swim lessons, free swim, LEGOS, nature/science, arts & crafts, and sports.

BUCKS AND DOES (Entering 1st & 2nd grade)

With a ratio of 8 campers to 1 staff, the Bucks & Does enjoy Camp Chase with age-appropriate activities. This nurturing environment is a high-energy, positive place to have your child all summer and has lots to offer. Camp activities include: swim lessons, free swim, LEGOS, nature/science, arts & crafts, and sports.

RASCALS (Entering 3rd & 4th grade)

With a ratio of 10 campers to 1 staff, the Rascals enjoy Camp Chase with age-appropriate activities. Once your child moves into the Rascals, the rock wall is introduced to their camp experience. This activity is located on our outdoor climbing wall with trained staff. A series of checks and balances go into the belay systems allowing the campers to climb up a two-story rock wall and descend in a safe environment. Camp activities include: swim lessons, free swim, LEGOS, nature/science, arts & crafts, sports, and rock climbing.

PIONEERS (Entering 5th & 6th grade)

With a ratio of 10 campers to 1 staff, the Pioneers enjoy Camp Chase with age-appropriate activities. Once your child moves into the Pioneers, they are introduced to Archery. This is held several times a week at our outdoor archery range. Our certified staff allows the campers to experience this program in a positive, safe environment. Camp activities include: swim lessons, free swim, LEGOS, nature/science, arts & crafts, sports, rock climbing, and archery.

RANGERS (entering 7th & 8th grade)

With a ratio of 10 campers to 1 staff, the Rangers enjoy Camp Chase with age-appropriate activities. Once your child moves into the Rangers they can do it all. New to 2012, we are introducing Mt. Boards. These are long boards that look like snow boards but have wheels and brakes. Helmets, knee pads, elbow pads, and wrist guards are required and supplied by the camp. "Ranger Trips" are a great time for our oldest campers. During weeks 2, 4, 6, 8 & 10, trips will be planned for tubing or mini golf. Additional fees of \$15 per camper and a special permission slip must be provided to the camp. Y-Financial Aid is available for anyone who cannot pay. Camp activities include: swim lessons, free swim, LEGOS, nature/science, arts & crafts, sports, rock climbing, archery, and Mt. Boards.

LEADERS IN TRAINING (LIT) (9TH GRADERS)

LITs will be spending their two weeks making the exciting transition from camper to leader and role model. They will focus on leadership development curriculum, including job training, team building workshops, and service learning opportunities while still enjoying many camp activities.

COUNSELORS IN TRAINING (CIT) (10TH GRADERS)

The four weeks are spent learning the intricacies of being a well-rounded, ultra-dynamic camp counselor, including specialized workshops, job-shadowing, and on-the-job learning opportunities. CITs who "graduate" will be eligible for the JC program as 11th graders. Completion of the application process, including an interview is required before registration.

JUNIOR COUNSELOR (JC) (11TH AND 12TH GRADES ONLY)

JCs, having completed the CIT program have a unique, hands-on opportunity to spend the summer working with campers in an assistant role to the counselors. A successful stint as a JC fills most school volunteer service requirements, looks great on resumes, and can lead to a future position at Camp Chase. Completion of the application and interview is required before registration.

SPECIALTY CAMPS

Specialty camps follow the same session schedule, daily hours of Camp Chase. Campers participating in specialty camps will not participate in theme weeks, and have limited access to traditional camp activities.

TRIPS CAMPS

New design for summer 2012, this camp is all about town. The camp is designed to make the most impact for our older campers. Special off-camp activities are in and around CT, MA & NY.

Fee: \$410 per week

ADVENTURE TRIPS

Grades 7th, 8th & 9th

This camp will take a tour of fun and exciting things in our area. Trips include: Qusassy Amusement Park, Coco Beach Indoor Water Park, YMCA Camp Jewell, and many more. Some trips will be duplicated over the several weeks. Campers must be able to enjoy fun, athletic activities.

OUTDOOR LIFE TRIPS

Grades 5th, 6th & 7th

These outdoor nature-based camps are based around the "No Child Left Inside" philosophy. Campers will experience trips to Kent Falls, Macedonia State Park, and many more. This Trips Camp will end with an overnight at YMCA Camp Jewell. Some trips will be duplicated over several weeks. Campers must be able to enjoy fun, athletic activities like hikes.
